
What part of Crispus Attucks's story stood out to you the most, and why?




In part, due to the French and Indian War, the British sustained significant debts. In order to increase revenue, they began to enact several taxes on the colonies.

These two quotes show a paradox because they talk about freedom, but not everyone was actually given freedom. The Declaration says that "all men are created equal," but many people, like enslaved Africans and women, were not treated equally. This shows the contradiction between the ideas of the Revolution and what really happened.


