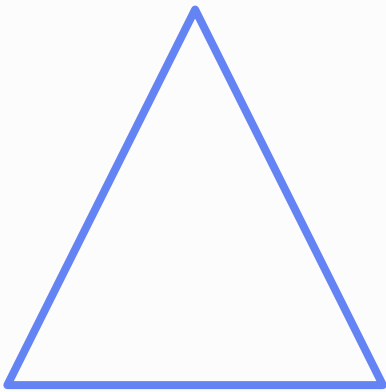

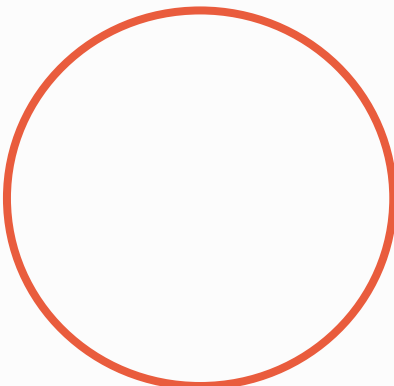

Cold War tensions often changed revolutionary movements by forcing them to choose sides and align with global superpowers. In Cuba, Fidel Castro's revolution initially had nationalist goals but became more aligned with communism and the USSR after the U.S. opposed the new regime. This shows how global pressures shifted revolutionary strategies and alliances, turning local movements into parts of broader geopolitical conflicts.

The Korean War was a proxy war that reflected Cold War rivalries between the United States and the Soviet Union. The United States, along with the United Nations, supported South Korea, while China and the Soviet Union backed North Korea. These alliances allowed the superpowers to fight indirectly through Korean forces rather than engaging in direct war. The Korean War is often called the Forgotten War because it receives less attention than other major conflicts, despite its importance in shaping Cold War dynamics.

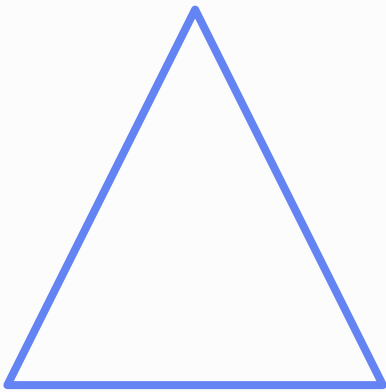

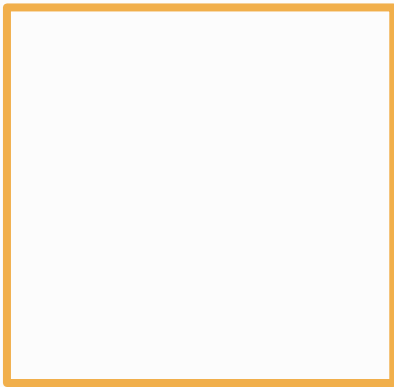

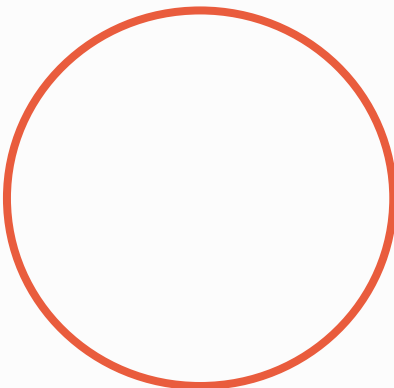
What three important ideas or facts did you learn today?
